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#### ORDER:-

In the reference 1<sup>st</sup> read above, the Government issued guidelines in connection with transfer of Engineering students from one College to another at 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year levels. According to these guidelines every year student transfer proposals, mainly at 2<sup>nd</sup> year level and a few cases at 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year level are being received from the Director of Technical Education for Government approval.

2. It has been noticed that the requests are increasing year after year mainly due to increase in number of Engineering Colleges every year. As on today there are 253 Engineering Colleges when compared to 57 Engineering Colleges in 1997, when the guidelines were issued last. It is observed that some students are seeking transfer to a better or nearer college in the 2<sup>nd</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> / 4<sup>th</sup> years within the University jurisdiction. It has also been noticed that such requests are also being received very late i.e., even long after the classes commence. In the light of the foregoing the Director of Technical Education has submitted proposals in the reference 2<sup>nd</sup> read above with a request to stipulate the condition that the applications for seeking transfer from one college to another should be restricted from 1<sup>st</sup> April of the year till the last date of the month in which examinations are completed.

3. It is also felt that keeping in view the practical experience in transfer cases till now the guidelines issued in the reference 1<sup>st</sup> read above need modification to suit the present scenario.

4. Accordingly, the Government after careful consideration of the above points and keeping in view of the difficulties faced by the students, while their requests are being processed at Government level decided that the power of transfer of students from one Engineering/ Pharmacy/Architecture College to another college at 2<sup>nd</sup>, 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> year be delegated to the Director of Technical Education, A.P., Hyderabad to avoid delay and hardship to the students with certain modifications to the existing guidelines. The following are the fresh guidelines issued for considering transfer applications of students of B.Tech./ B.Pharm / B.Arch. courses in the State.

- i. In case of University colleges, no transfers shall be permitted from one University College to another University College. Transfer from Private Engineering College to a University College in any region shall not be permitted, because the University colleges are opted by the students securing top rank in EAMCET and subsequent entry of other students not only causes practical problems, but also creates an imbalance in the homogeneity of the learners group.

- ii. Transfers to Regional Engineering Institutes (NITS) shall not be permitted as the institutions are exclusive in nature.
- iii. The transfers may be permitted from one affiliated College to another or from a University College to a private (affiliated) College within the same university at the 2<sup>nd</sup> year stage on production of NOCs from both the colleges.
- iv. No transfers can be permitted from one University affiliated private college to another University affiliated private college as all the Universities in the State are not following uniform syllabus and uniform system of examination. The total transfers including III & IV year if any should not exceed more than 1% of the total strength of the first year of the College. Transfers at III and IV year can be considered under extreme hardship conditions on a case by case consideration. In addition, the transferee college may be permitted to fill up the unfilled seats of the previous year by transfer from the colleges affiliated to the same university on production of NOCs from both the Colleges.
- v. In case of obtaining NOCs from both the Institutions, the students should be willing to pay the remaining fee for the entire four-year-course both to the Institution being relinquished and also to the institution to which the transfer is sought for.
- vi. The transfer should be only in that branch of Engineering in which the student was studying in the College from where the transfer is sought.
- vii. The applications received from 1<sup>st</sup> of April of every year till the last date of the month in which examinations are completed at 1<sup>st</sup> / 2<sup>nd</sup>/3<sup>rd</sup> year levels shall only be considered and the DTE shall dispose of all the requests received, before commencement of the 2<sup>nd</sup> / 3<sup>rd</sup> /4<sup>th</sup> years as the case may be so that the students seeking transfers will not be put to hardship of falling short of attendance.

5. The Director of Technical Education shall ensure that the guidelines are communicated to all Technical Institutions in the State for information and take necessary action accordingly for following the above guidelines scrupulously.

**AMENDMENT**

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**ORDER:**

In the reference 1<sup>st</sup> read above, Government have issued orders for Admission of Foreign Nationals / Persons of Indian Origin (PIOs) / Children of Indian workers in the Gulf Countries seeking admissions in the Engineering Colleges in the State of Andhra Pradesh.

2. The Government have noticed that certain institutions in the State are admitting students from foreign countries without following the guidelines. Government have also absorbed that there is no mechanism to supervise & monitor the admission of such students in their institutions. In order to streamline the admission procedure Government have decided to issue detail guidelines in the matter.

3. Therefore, Government in supesession of the orders issued in the G.O 1<sup>st</sup> read above, hereby issue the following guidelines for admission of Foreign Nationals/PIO/ Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries into All India Council for Technical Education approved Institutions in the State under Supernumerary quota:-

**Guidelines for admission of Foreign Nationals/PIO/ Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries into AICTE approved Institutions under Supernumerary quota**

**Supernumerary seats and distribution of seats:**

- The supernumerary quota for Foreign Nationals/PIO/Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries (FN/PIO/CWG) shall be applicable only to those AICTE approved institutions offering Technical courses leading to Degree and Post Graduate Degree in Engineering & Technology, Pharmacy, Architecture & Town Planning, MBA & MCA which have approval for the seats/scheme for every academic year.
- No institute shall fill in excess of 15% of the approved intake seats per course under this programme.
- The supernumerary seats shall be exclusively meant for the said three categories of FN/PIO/CWG students provided that 1/3<sup>rd</sup> of the 15% seats shall be reserved to each of these categories.
- Any vacant seats out of 1/3<sup>rd</sup> reserved for each category shall be open for admission to other categories.
- Under no circumstances a seat remains unfilled shall be allowed to anyone other than the said categories.

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- Foreign nationals/ PIO/Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries admitted in the approved institutions as **Govt. of India nominee** shall be included within the ceiling of 15% only.

**Eligibility criterion:**

- The candidate seeking admission under this category of Foreign nationals/PIO/Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries in any of professional courses should satisfy the eligibility criteria as prescribed by All India Council for Technical Education in All India Council for Technical Education approved process Hand book from time to time.

**Admissions:**

- The Institutions shall admit students under Foreign Nationals/PIO/Children of Indian workers in Gulf countries categories directly or through Government recognized Educational Agencies upto the limit of intake permitted by All India Council for Technical Education subject to obtaining affiliation to the programme from the concerned university.
- Admissions to the institutions under this scheme shall be done on merit basis among applicants.
- The Institutions shall adhere to the admission schedule announced by the Government/Competent Authority in respect of the courses offered. However, the institutions are required to submit the complete list of students admitted latest by 31<sup>st</sup> of July of the academic year indicating the following details.
  - (a) Back ground and track record of the Students
  - (b) Passport particulars
  - (c) Residential Addresses
  - (d) Country of Origin
  - (e) Visa documents and such other documents as may be necessary
  - (f) Fee charged.
- Such lists shall be submitted to the following authorities. An amount of Rs.500/- per student shall be paid towards service charges in the form of DD obtained from any nationalized bank in favour of the Secretary, A.P. State Council of Higher Education , Hyderabad along with a request of process and accord approvals and be furnished to
  - a. Competent Authority (A.P. State Council of Higher Education)
  - b. Commissioner of Technical Education, Govt. of Andhra Pradesh.
- It shall be incumbent upon the institution to verify the bonafide of the students, their background and track records ensuring the interests of the country and its security concerns before giving admission.

**Authority for approval of admissions:**

- A committee under the Chairmanship of Commissioner of Technical Education with the following members shall be constituted to look into the list of admitted candidates along with the relevant documents.
  - Commissioner of Technical Education (CTE), Govt. of A.P.
  - Secretary, A.P. State Council of Higher Education.
  - Joint Director, O/o Commissioner of Technical Education (Convener)



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- The Commissioner of Technical Education shall address the Police authorities by sending relevant records of all the candidates admitted and received from the respective institutions for verification of their credentials namely passport, visa, country of origin, background etc.
- The Secretary, A.P. State Council of Higher Education along with the officials concerned in State Council shall verify the academic credentials of admitted candidates as per All India Council for Technical Education guidelines.
- The Committee then forward the lists to the Competent Authority for final grant of necessary approval of admissions.
- The Competent Authority shall send the relevant information regarding the candidates admitted to the Principal Secretary to Govt., Higher Education Department for onward transmission to the Ministry of External Affairs and All India Council for Technical Education , New Delhi and also to the Registrar of the university concerned.

**Tuition Fees:**

- The admission & Fee Regulatory Committee (AFRC) shall fix the Tuition fee and other fee for candidates to be admitted under the scheme. Fees prescribed for NRI quota seats shall not be applicable to these admissions. The children of Indian workers in Gulf countries shall be treated at par with resident citizens.

4. The Commissioner of Technical Education / Secretary, A.P. State Council of Higher Education, Hyderabad shall take necessary further action accordingly.
